- 31. (a) **Explanation:** As safety guidelines are not observed by many school buses, so regional transport authority should carry out checks of all the buses fitted with CNG Kit. So, course of action I follows. CNG is a pollution free fuel and its sources are more than petrol and diesel So, it should be encouraged but with safety norms. So, course of action II and III do not follow.
- 32. (b) Course of action I follows because with a graded approach to the use of antibiotics, under which some medicines are reserved for the most resistant microbes, the WHO list can stop their misuse as broad-spectrum treatments. Course of action II also follows because a close inspection is also needed of

- the national supervisory programmes to help people to get rid out of it.
- 33. (c) (i) is not an appropriate course of action as it not known from the statement weather the protest are violent or peaceful. (ii) is preventive measure not a corrective action. As it is mentioned in the statement that the given state has faced several drought like situations over the recent years, so (iii) is an appropriate course of action.
- 34. (b) Course of action I does not follows due to the words 'all' and 'immediate'. Course of action II follows because a system should be implemented to certify the quality of tiffin provided by the school.

Sol. (35-36):

35. (a) Only I

Action I is necessary to solve the problem.

Actions II and III are not advisable because the matter is very sensitive. The problem is not of one or two sugar mills. All sugar mill owners are opposing the decision of the government.

- 36. (b) II and III only
 - The Government should immediately completely ban use of scanners/ sonography on expectant mothers at all health centers
 - →This will help eliminate the pre-natal sex determination technique used by parents to avoid girl child, but this cannot be done as doing sonography is important to know fetus' health.
 - II. The Government should announce a substantial incentive scheme for couples who have at least one girl child.
 - →This will provide a good incentive for couples to have a daughter as they would receive benefits from government because financial weakness is also a reason of female foeticide.
 - III. The Government should launch a nationwide campaign to create awareness against female foeticide. →This is an intelligent step and will help eradicate foeticide problem in the long run by changing the attitude of parents towards the girl child.
 - Hence, only II and III are effective steps to reverse the trend.

Sol. (37-38):

- 37. (e) There being faulty questions in the examination paper is a blunder on the part of school management and students should not be made to suffer on account of this. Thus, a re-test should be organized for the students and those responsible for the error be penalized to prevent reoccurrence of such mistake in the future. Hence, both the courses of action follow.
- 38. (e) Clearly, something should be done to alert the trains well in advance in case of a landslide and also some means should be adopted to prevent blockage of tracks during landslides. Thus, both I and II follow.
- 39. (e) Both I and II follows as salary is an important factor for encouraging students to opt teaching as a career option rather than job and changing the eligibility criterion to graduation for being a teacher as generally the students choose their career option after graduation.
